All our senses are precious, but sight is the sense people fear losing the most, yet many of us don't know how to look after our eyes.

It is recommended that everyone get their eyes tested at least once every two years, even if no vision problems have been noticed. Maintain a healthy weight and move more

Being overweight and/or lack of exercise can raise the risk of developing some of the major causes of sight loss, such as diabetes or high blood pressure.

Stop Smoking

After ageing, smoking is the biggest risk factor for developing several of the most common sight loss conditions.

Protect your eyes from the sun

Your sunglasses should have the CE mark which ensures that they are giving you the right level of ultraviolet protection. Children should spend time outdoors for healthy eye development, but don't forget hats and
