


make these events happen and make them so enjoyable



Have Your Say: West Berkshire Council's Budget Consultation

West Berkshire Council is inviting residents to share their views on proposed budget changes for the 2025/26 financial year. The council is proposing service changes and income-generating measures, including:

- Outsourcing Adult Social Care Resource Centre services. Discontinuing the mobile library service.
- Increasing certain fees and charges above inflation.
- Reducing winter gritting routes & removing some waste bins.
- Turning off streetlights in residential roads overnight.

Residents are encouraged to review the proposals and share their feedback via the consultation survey. The consultation will inform decisions at council meetings in February 2025. For details and to participate, visit the council's budget consultation webpage.

Calcot Infant and Junior School

We began the school year by collecting donations for the West Berkshire Food Bank. With our generous families contributing 238kgs of food (about the weight of a full-grown dolphin) which provided 500 meals for local families in need. In preparation for the Turn Tilehurst Red competition, the children created poppy displays for the school and we were proud to win 1st place! On November 8th, Mrs Rostron and the choir participated in the Remembrance ceremony at the Tilehurst Triangle. The children sang beautifully. The choir also performed at the Autumn Concert with the Waltham St Lawrence Silver Band and joined the Christmas event at Bucklebury Farm.

The infants took part in a Diwali workshop with the Don Rae Academy and parents had the chance to watch the children's performance. Looking ahead, we have exciting schools trips planned to the Winchester Science Museum an the Imperial War Museum along with a pantomime and nativity performances.

Nominations open on 20th January 2025

Categories

1) June Scott Award for Best Environment Champion(s)

Awarded to groups or individuals for small or large projects which have improved the environment of Holybrook.

2) Young Person(s) of the Year:

For person (s) under the age of 25 years, who have achieved something exceptional for or brought credit to the community of Holybrook.

3) Good Neighbour of the Year:

An individual award for an exceptional neighbour who makes a difference and/or improvement to you or your street's life.

4) Service with a Smile:

Awarded to an individual who always provides you 'service with a smile' and/or someone who goes above and beyond their usual job in the Parish of Holybrook.

5) Unsung Hero:

Awarded to an individual, who is silently engages in community services under their own initiative.

Please submit nominations either by e-mail, post, WhatsApp or hand, to the Parish Office by Friday 7th March 2025

A valid nomination must state:

Category entered. Name of nominee. Contact address of nominee. Description of why your nominee should receive an award. Your name and contact details.

- 1. Councillors and staff can be nominated for awards. However, councillors and staff may not nominate one another.
- 2. Nominations may not be made where the work/task completed was paid work (except the Service with a Smile category).
- 3. If your nominee is under the age of 18, please obtain parental or guardian consent before making the nomination.
- 4. Anyone under the age of 18, who is attending the Annual Assembly, must be accompanied by a parent/legal guardian.
- 5. Nominees must live within the Parish of Holybrook or within three miles of the Parish boundary and must have made a contribution to the Parish within the last year (March 2024-March 2025).
- 6. Entries to be submitted to the Parish Office either by e-mail, post or hand. The Council may provide nomination form drop-off points and will advise via the noticeboards if it does so.
- 7. You can submit more than one nomination in each category.
- 8. You can only nominate the same person/group once in each relevant category.
- 9. The Council reserves the right to withdraw a category if no appropriate nominations are received.
- 10. Further information can be found on the Parish Council's website from 20th January 2025 when nominations formally open. Nominations close at 13:00 on Friday 7th March 2025.
