

# HOLYBROOK PARISH NEWS December 2025

Proudly serving the residents of Holybrook Parish since 2000

Thank you to everyone who completed the questionnaire, attended the public meeting at the Beansheaf Centre or drop-in session at Kennet Valley Free Church. Your participation shows how much our community cares, especially during a time of uncertainty around the local authority restructuring proposals.

The results are clear: residents expressed strong concerns regards the proposals, with an average score of 4.7 out of 5. When asked about preferred options, 73% of respondents chose the Ridgeway option, 17% selected Reading, 2% had no preference, 6% were

undecided and 3% did not answer that question. It's heartening to see strong community support; the Parish Council scored 4.39 out of 5, showing residents value their local services and the role we play.

All questions raised by residents have been submitted to Reading and West Berkshire Councils. Their responses are available on our website or directly from the Parish Office. The Parish Council has also sent a letter, reflecting your views, to the Secretary of State and West Berkshire and Reading Borough Councils. Now we await Central Government's decision as to whether either or neither of the proposals will be taken further. Formal consultation is expected in spring 2026.

It was an honour for Cllr Clive Littlewood and I to attend the Remembrance Day Service at Holy Trinity Theale and lay a wreath on behalf of the Council (Photo credit: Theale Parish Council).

Looking forward, the presentation of The Holybrook Community Spirit Awards will take place at The Annual Assembly on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> March 2026 and I'm delighted to announce the launch of two new awards; the 'Blooming Beauties' and 'Photography' Competitions. We will conclude our Silver Anniversary Year with a celebratory Picnic in the Park on Monday 4th May 2026.



Your feedback does matter and we have taken on board residents' request for public meetings to be held during the day, as well as evenings, and in both sides of the Parish. We'd also like to know if there's any information you'd like to see in the newsletter whether just parish news or local stories, games and puzzles, articles from connected groups...

Heartfelt thanks to all our councillors and staff for their service and work throughout the year. 






The next litter pick will be in Beansheaf on Saturday 17th January — do come along, bring friends and help keep our area looking great!





# 12 Days of Winter Wildlife in Holybrook

This December, while twinkling lights brighten Calcot's streets, nature is putting on its own festive show! From chirping robins to darting squirrels, there's plenty of winter wildlife waiting to be spotted in our parks, gardens and hedgerows. Here are twelve to watch for this Christmas season (don't forget your camera!):

- 2) Blackbird Watch them turning fallen leaves for worms around gardens and shrubs.
- 3) **Redwing** Winter visitors from Scandinavia; spot flocks feeding on berries in open spaces.
- 4) Fieldfare Larger thrushes with grey heads. Often seen in frosty fields or perched on hawthorn.
- 5) Blue & Great Tits Tiny bursts of colour hopping around feeders and holly bushes.
- 6) **House Sparrow** Chattering in roof eaves or thick hedges, reminding us that nature's close by.
- 7) **Mallard** Glide across ponds and streams, brightening cold mornings with their green sheen.
- 8) Grey Squirrel Ever-busy acorn hoarders. Look up in mature trees along the footpaths.
- 9) **Fox** Early risers might glimpse their russet coats crossing frosty lawns.
- 10) **Hedgehog** Usually hibernating, but mild spells might stir one under log piles.
- 11) Pheasant Vibrant flashes of colour on farmland edges at dawn or dusk.
- 12) Holly & Ivy Winter's natural décor and vital food for birds.
