Help Protect our Parish's Heritage!

The Parish Council is making applications to the Heritage Forum to help safeguard some of Holybrook's most cherished sites.

Linear Park is the first focus, with features that, we believe, make it worthy of listing:



- **20 Trees Orchard:** Planted in 2020 to mark the Council's 20th anniversary.
- **Jubilee Wood:** Planted in 2012 to celebrate the Diamond Jubilee.
- **Battle of Agincourt Tree:** Commemorates the 600th anniversary of the battle.
- **The 21 Oaks:** Memorial to the 21 local men who fell in WWI, now with a 'Tommy' figure and bench.
- **Water Pump:** Dating back to 1832, now in the Sensory Garden (already listed in its own right).
- **Ancient Hedgerows:** Along the edge of the Holy Brook.
- **Cobnut Walk:** Planted in 2003 to celebrate the area's cobnut heritage.



At the same time, the Council will also apply to list the Covid-Memorial trees on Underwood Road and the Pill Box on the Fairfields estate. Have you visited these local assets? Please do take the time to check them out.

We'd love your help! If you know of any historic sites, trees or landmarks in the Parish that are not already listed—or have old photos or stories—please share them. Whilst the Council doesn't decide what gets listed, every suggestion will be considered and, where appropriate, a listing application will be made. When our applications are due to be heard by the panel, we will inform residents via our socials, website and noticeboards.

Interested in local history? If you'd like to start a local history group, get in touch, we may be able to help you get started.

Let's work together to recognise and protect our Parish's unique history!

Friends of Linear Park - Welcome to 2026

A new year in the park, combined with a fresh fall of snow, created a perfect winter wonderland for those brave enough to wrap up warm and venture out to enjoy the seasonality of the park.



The new accessible path, at the edge of the football field in the west of the park, running from the car park to Fairfields, has been especially welcome. In addition, the grass path leading from Fairfields into the park has been laid with wood chippings, providing a cleaner and more practical access route.



Recently, a large bough fell from the willow tree near the Beansheaf Centre.

Following inspection, the tree was deemed unsafe and had to be felled. The logs were left on site, with 15 used to create a balance-run row for youngsters but it is great that adults have also been spotted giving it a go! Smaller logs were cut and arranged into a hopscotch trail in the woods, and a stack of split logs has also been left for future use. The remaining branches were put through a chipper, with the resulting chippings spread along the woodland paths (as mentioned above). Nothing has gone to waste.

Hazel and willow in the park have also been coppiced, sparking creativity within the group. This has led to the making of woven hurdles and, taking skills one step further, decorative finials for the tops.

The request was refused, so the Parish Council is now investigating a suitable location for a bin to help reduce litter on this site. The Parish Council is also seeking to install a further new bin on Charrington Road.



Electric Vehicle Charging for Homes Without Driveways

West Berkshire Council has received funding from the Department for Transport to help residents, without off-street parking, charge electric vehicles safely near their homes. The funding will support the installation of recessed cross-pavement charging channels, allowing charging cables to run beneath the footway. Trailing charging cables across pavements is not permitted and is **an offence under Section 178 of the Highways Act 1980** due to the risk of obstruction and injury to pedestrians.

Residents will only need to fund the channel installation, if their location is suitable, and some households may be eligible for additional Government grants towards a charge point.
