

WBC is in the final year of the Grounds Maintenance contract. Therefore, they are retendering the district grounds maintenance contract this year with the new contract starting in January 2023.



Look at your home security in a new light as clocks go forward

As we enjoy the longer days it is important that people remain mindful of their home security.

With the weather improving, more people leave windows open and doors unlocked whilst they are out in their gardens, putting them at a higher risk of being burgled.

There are a number of simple steps that can be taken to minimise the risk to your home:

- 1. Lock your doors while working in the garden;
- 2. Close your windows in areas that are accessible to a thief, such as a flat roof or rear window next to garden furniture that can be used as a climbing aid;
- 3. Close the downstairs windows or doors after they have been opened in hot weather;
- Keep an eye on neighbours' homes when they are on holiday. Consider opening and closing their blinds for them and collecting their mail.

Maintenance continues and all entrances to the park have been cleaned/swept, trimmed back, including Cow Lane which had a Friends of Linear Park makeover!

POLICE

Thames Valley Police – Pangbourne Neighbourhood Police Team The team relocated to Theale Community Fire Station in November 2021 and are now fully operational from that new site. This allows us close access to the Holybrook community and, currently, we have a team of 9 Officers covering all of our local Parishes.



May we remind residents that if you witness an incident it would be best to contact TVP directly on 101 (or 999 if it is an emergency.) We have recently received some reports, via the Holybrook Parish Office, that would have been more effectively dealt with if they had been reported to us in the first instance as the incident is occurring. There are two new gates into the park – Mill Lane and Burghfield Road entrances now have key access for motorized wheelchairs.

The park holds the prestigious Green Flag and, this year, the park will be inspected 'Unannounced' which means we have no idea when the inspector will call. Please help us to keep the park clean and tidy by picking up after your dog and taking your litter home.

Hard work in the community garden is making it an oasis within the park where people can sit quietly on the duck seat, take time to think and reflect and enjoy the Friendship stones.

Enjoy the Jubilee weekend – maybe take a walk in the park or

enjoy a picnic - there are benches near to several of the play areas or just take a blanket and sit under a shady tree. Whatever you do over the bank holiday weekend – enjoy!
