#### Dear All

A lot has been happening during the summer months!

**Garage Kiosk, Linear Park:** The Garage is now officially open and is already proving extremely popular. Check out @thegaragekioskatlinearpark on Facebook to stay up-to-date on opening times and more.



Solar panels at the Beansheaf Centre: Thanks to a generous grant from West Berkshire Council, under the Levelling Up Fund, and with Community Infrastructure Levy monies, solar panels have been installed at the Beansheaf Centre. This step not only reduces our carbon footprint but, importantly, reduces our running costs; allowing us to continue to support our community groups by keeping hire fees as low as possible whilst maintaining the Centre to a high standard.

**Improved Park Access:** By the time you read this, the pathway from the Linear Park car park to the Fairfields development should be complete. This will provide better access to Otter Drive, Bainbridge Road and Balfour Drive. At Otter Drive the path will connect naturally to the Park through an informal walking route.

**Community Safety:** The summer has been glorious in many ways but, sadly, the Parish has experienced several criminal acts of arson, damage and graffiti. CCTV footage and evidence from several incidents are in the hands of Thames Valley Police.

**Upcoming Public Meeting:** There are many questions around the proposals to create a large unitary authority, The Ridgeway Council, and Reading Borough Council's proposal for a boundary change. To give residents a chance to hear directly from council leaders and ask questions, a public meeting will be held on **Monday 13<sup>th</sup> October 2025** at the Beansheaf Centre, Linear Hall. The doors will open at 6pm with formal sessions taking place at 6.30pm and 7.30pm. More details will be published on our website and in the noticeboards nearer the time.

**Drop-in sessions:** An informal session for residents to share views, ask questions, or drop-off their completed questionnaires (enclosed and available on our website) will be held at Kennet Valley Free Church on: **Saturday 25th October 2025 from 2.00pm until 4.00pm** (please note no District Council representatives will be present at this session).

**Remembrance Sunday:** It will be an honour and privilege to represent the Parish on Remembrance Sunday (9<sup>th</sup> November) at Holy Trinity Church, Theale, where a wreath will be laid on behalf of Holybrook Parish. Everyone is welcome.

#### Dads Hub: Last Tuesday of the month, 5.30—7pm



#### Hedgehogs, Hibernation & Halloween

Hedgehogs typically hibernate between October/November and March/April. To endure the colder months, they build up fat reserves during autumn. Since hedgehogs may give birth as late as September, providing supplementary food helps young hoglets gain enough weight before winter. Continue offering food and fresh water throughout hibernation, when natural sources are scarce. Kitten biscuits with meat as the first ingredient are ideal.

After the recent dry summer, other wildlife will also benefit from shallow containers of clean water in gardens. Hedgehogs may change nests during hibernation and sometimes wake to eat or drink. If a nest is found, cover it back up immediately and contact a local rescue centre; do not touch or move it. Hedgehogs seen in daylight may need urgent help. Observe from a distance, record details and seek advice from a rescue centre straight away.

**Meet Daisy** 

Daisy was hand-reared from two days old by a local centre. Released at seven weeks, she is now 12 weeks old and thriving in her new environment.

Finally, remember pumpkins left outdoors after Halloween are harmful to hedgehogs, causing severe digestive issues. Please compost them, donate them to wildlife centres, or hang them for birds.

The Government is reviewing local councils to:

- Reduce the number of local council 'tiers' (West Berkshire currently has two tiers; West Berkshire Council
  and your Parish Council. In other parts of the country there are three tiers; County Council, District Council
  and Parish Council).
- Create District Councils serving a population of about **500,000 residents**.

Two proposals may affect our area:

**Proposal 1 "Ridgeway" Council:** Join West Berkshire, South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse into one larger council.

**Proposal 2 "Greater Reading":** Move Calcot, Holybrook, Pangbourne, Purley on Thames, Theale, Tidmarsh and Tilehurst into a Greater Reading area.
