As we wrap up another council year, I'm delighted to share some fantastic news! After years of discussions with West Berkshire Council, and a determined battle with the Highways Department, we now have official road name signs, at the entrances to the Parish, proudly displaying the Holybrook coat of arms! While we didn't get the 'welcome gates' we had hoped for, this is still a wonderful achievement and another step in strengthening our parish identity.

Spring has certainly put on a beautiful display this year! It's been a joy to see the flowers we planted returning in full bloom; including some that didn't appear last year. We've also planted circles of snowdrops around the Covid-19 Memorial Cherry Trees on Underwood Road, creating a lasting tribute and symbol of our resilience.

Meanwhile, the Council's Community and Environment Committee has been hard at work on a range of exciting projects, from mapping biodiversity to working with agencies to improve the condition of The Holy Brook. On 1st April, we proudly launched our Biodiversity Citizen Science Initiative in collaboration with Beansheaf Pre-School! This is a fantastic opportunity for everyone to get involved; simply download a habitat tick sheet from our website (or pick up a copy from the Parish Office), record the flora and fauna you spot in your garden, or any local green space, and return it to us. Your input will help shape a long-term plan to protect and enhance our natural environment.

We are incredibly grateful for our amazing volunteers who generously give their time to plant bulbs, litter-pick, take part in speed watch and so much more. Spending time outdoors and connecting with others is proven to be great for our well-being—so why not join us at an event that interests you? You'll be amazed at what we can achieve together in just an hour!

2025 marks the Silver Anniversary of the Parish Council starting with the Council's Annual Meeting, taking place on Monday 12th May, at the Beansheaf Centre. 
from natural poles and park debris. Have you spotted it yet?


Wishing all our park visitors a very Happy Easter! Keep your eyes peeled; how many real Easter bunnies can you spot while exploring?

Community Litter Pick: Another Successful Effort, But **Challenges Remain**

Once again, our wonderful community has come together to tackle the growing problem of litter on our streets. We are delighted to report that our latest community litter pick was a great success, with over 20 dedicated volunteers, including families, turning out to help keep your parish clean. Thanks to their hard work and commitment, over 25 bags of litter were collected from the Fords Farm/Underwood Road areas, making a real difference to our shared spaces.





A particularly important reminder: Glass must never be disposed of in the bins provided for dog waste. This poses a serious hazard to the contractors who empty these bins, and we must all take responsibility to ensure their safety. Please dispose of glass in the appropriate recycling bins.

On the subject of bins, we would also like to remind residents that, while our parish council employs a contractor to empty our litter and dog waste bins, there are several additional bins throughout the Parish that are the responsibility of West Berkshire Council. COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH: MAKING OUR ROADS SAFER

Monitoring speeding through our Parish isn't about seeing who is breaking the law; it's about keeping our roads safe for everyone. That's why our volunteer **Community Speed Watch** team has been out recently keeping an eye on the traffic.

During a recent morning session on Charrington Road, over 70 vehicles passed by, and the speeds of 51 of those vehicles were recorded. The average speed was 27.9mph, but 11 drivers were over 30mph, with three reaching speeds of 35mph.

While most drivers are responsible, even a small number of speeding vehicles can pose a risk—especially to pedestrians, cyclists and local wildlife (we sadly saw a few deceased hedgehogs on our roads over the winter). A few extra miles per hour might not seem like much, but it can make a big difference in avoiding sudden hazards, from crossing pedestrians to pets unexpectedly running into the road. Sadly, several residents have reported either losing a pet or having a much loved pet injured on our roads.

The good news? **The Community Speed Watch team is making a difference!** But we need more volunteers to keep up the momentum. If you'd like to help make our roads safer, we'd love to hear from you.

New Projects on the Horizon!

New Bus Shelters – Coming This Spring!

Six new bus shelters are set to pop up along the existing route, making waits more comfortable at Kettering Close (x2), Pemberton Gardens, Ledbury Drive, Swanholm Gardens and Sutherland Grove. This fantastic upgrade is fully funded by a grant we secured through West Berkshire Council's Bus Services Improvement Plan, backed by the Department for Transport.



Solar Power for the Beansheaf Centre!

Pending planning approval, the Beansheaf Centre will soon be powered by 50 solar panels, cutting energy costs and boosting

sustainability. The total cost? £32,724.25—but, thanks to a successful funding bid, we've secured £18,528 from West Berkshire Council's Rural England Prosperity Fund under the Village Hall and Community Building Grant Scheme.
