Dear Holybrook Residents

The late spell of lovely warm weather in September was a welcome extension to our summer but we are now into autumn and thinking of spring! With this in mind, please come to our Spring Bulb Planting Event; we'd love as many residents to get involved as possible. More details about this can be found on page 4 (the back page). And, if you are a local business and would like to donate some bulbs to the event please contact me.

We have received a lot of positive feedback on the completion of pathways at Sharnwood Drive and Deerhurst/Mill Lane. A big thank you to West Berkshire Council for their contribution to both projects.

Coming soon: a new noticeboard and bin at Underwood Road and a bin at the Dorking Way/Charrington Road junction. And, we have arranged, with West Berkshire Council (WBC), for the 30mph speed limit to be painted on all entrance roads to the Parish off the A4 which includes Dorking Way, Charrington Road and Mill Lane. This will highlight the change of speed limit to motorists. We have also arranged with West Berkshire Council for the road markings along the A4 to be renewed including the yellow box junction at Langley Hill.

Actions and progress:

We have been working with WBC on our Accessibility Project and 19 locations for dropped kerbs have been identified: two in Fords Farm, the remainder throughout Beansheaf. Each one will include tactile surfacing on both sides. This is, of course, subject to final authorisation but we hope that the work will be completed within this financial year.

The bark has been topped up in our playgrounds in accordance with our maintenance plan as well as necessary repairs to the edging boards in the Underwood Road playground.

To support Calcot School's Park and Stride scheme, parents and guardians are welcome to use the Beansheaf Centre Car Park for school drop-offs and pick-ups.

We continue to improve the Beansheaf Centre to bring the building up to modern standards and improve energy efficiency. The main internal fire doors are to be replaced this autumn as well as solar film being applied to the Linear Hall's park facing windows.

We have taken the first step to convert the former tractor garage into a refreshment kiosk by applying for pre-planning advice.

Spotlight on our wildlife:

Hedgehogs

Fun Facts!

- * Hedgehogs are lactose intolerant! Milk can make hedgehogs quite poorly, instead, shallow dishes of water will always be welcome.
- * Hedgehogs have very small mouths; if feeding them, meat-based kitten biscuits in a shallow dish along with water would be great.
- * These nocturnal creatures are active during the night; if you see one during the day it will likely need to go to a rescue centre.
- * Hedgehogs rely on their keen sense of smell and hearing due to poor eyesight and they are very good climbers!
- * Hedgehogs can travel up to approximately 2km each night, sometimes up to 3km during mating season.
- * Hedgehogs build nests under hedges, in compost piles, piles of leaves or logs, behind sheds, under decking, in sheds etc if accessible and in specially made hedgehog houses. Nests are made with dry leaves/garden material or dust extracted straw. Perhaps you could build a hedgehog home in your garden?
- * Halloween & Bonfire Night: If you're carving pumpkins for Halloween, dispose of them thoughtfully and put them high up where hedgehogs can't reach them; they can make hogs extremely poorly. Carefully check leaf/log piles for nesting hedgehogs before starting a bonfire .
- * Hedgehogs hibernate over winter, but might, occasionally, wakeup for food or water.

Friends of Linear Park – Stepping out in Autumn

Hurray! We have done it again! The prestigious 'Green Flag' will be flying high in the Park for the 14th year in a row mainly due to the hard work of the Friends of Linear Park who have a very dedicated team of volunteers overseeing maintenance within the Park every week and keeping up very high standards.

With the completion of the Bellway housing at Fairfield's, at the far end of Linear Park (West), the Friends have cleared and widened a footway/path across the farmer's field to the boundary of the new Bellway homes (near to the pond/water feature/attenuation feature) making the Park more accessible for the new residents.

The new cycle shelter, by the Beansheaf Centre, is progressing and the framework has been painted. We are now awaiting the racks and cover.
